Introduction

Welcome to Swimming Canada's Learning Management System (LMS). This user guide is designed for you and explains the various system features.

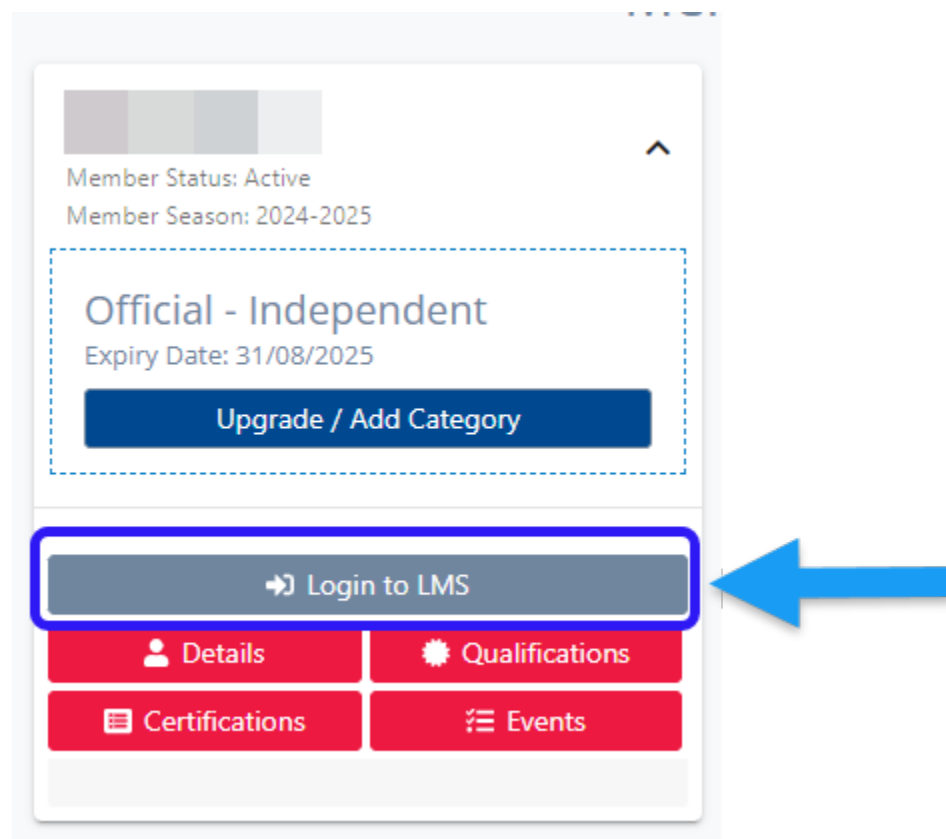
Throughout this user guide, you will be provided with a series of screen shots to help you navigate through the website.

In order to gain access to the LMS, you must be a registered official in the Swimming Canada Registration and Events Management System (REMS) and be registered – Status Active. **You will login from the REMS.**

Logging into the LMS

When you want to access the LMS you must login to your REMS account. You will only have access to the LMS once you are registered and have updated your information (status Active). Please wait for instructions from your club for registration. Contact your Club Official Administrator.

Once you login to your REMS account click on the "Login to LMS" GREY button

Welcome

The **Welcome** page provides a brief description of each tab available across the top of the page.

Status

The **Status** page is where you can enroll in any eLearning modules available and see what official's courses you have completed.

This page displays all of the eLearning modules that are available for officials. Official's can enroll in any eLearning modules by clicking the **Enroll** button beside the module they would like to take.

Session

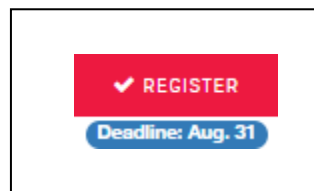
The **Session** page serves as a bookmark. When the **Session** tab is selected, it will bring you directly to the last eLearning module page you were working on prior to logging out of the LMS.

Clinics

This page is where you can browse through the clinics that are available to you. You are able to narrow your search by using the different filter options.

You will be able to see the **Register** button as shown in the image below. The deadline shown under the **Register** button is the course registration deadline.

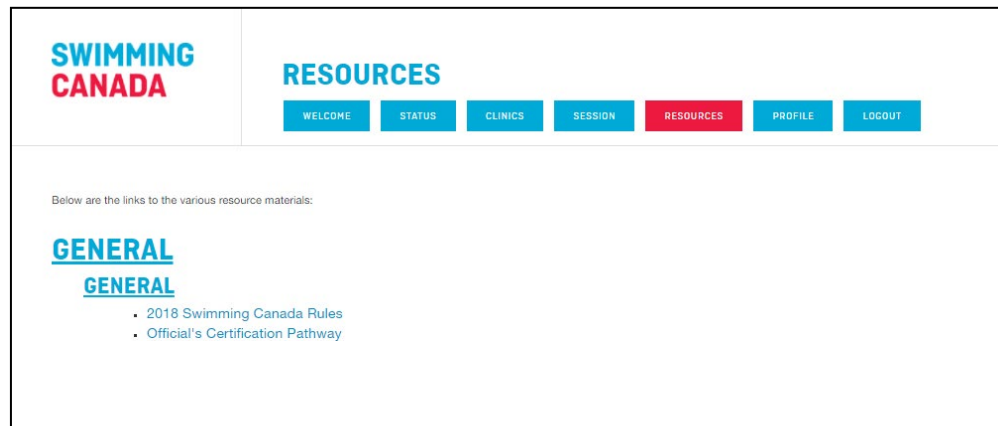

Resources

The **Resources** tab is where you can find additional official's resources. This tab is constantly being updated to provide you with information to help enhance your learning and development.



Profile

The **Profile** tab is where all your contact and sign-up information is stored in the LMS.

Any information in the **Profile** tab must be updated in your profile through Swimming Canada's REMS (<https://swimming.canada.sportsmanager.ie/sportlomo/users/login>). Once the information has been updated in the REMS, simply refresh your "Profile" tab in the LMS and the new information will appear.

Logout

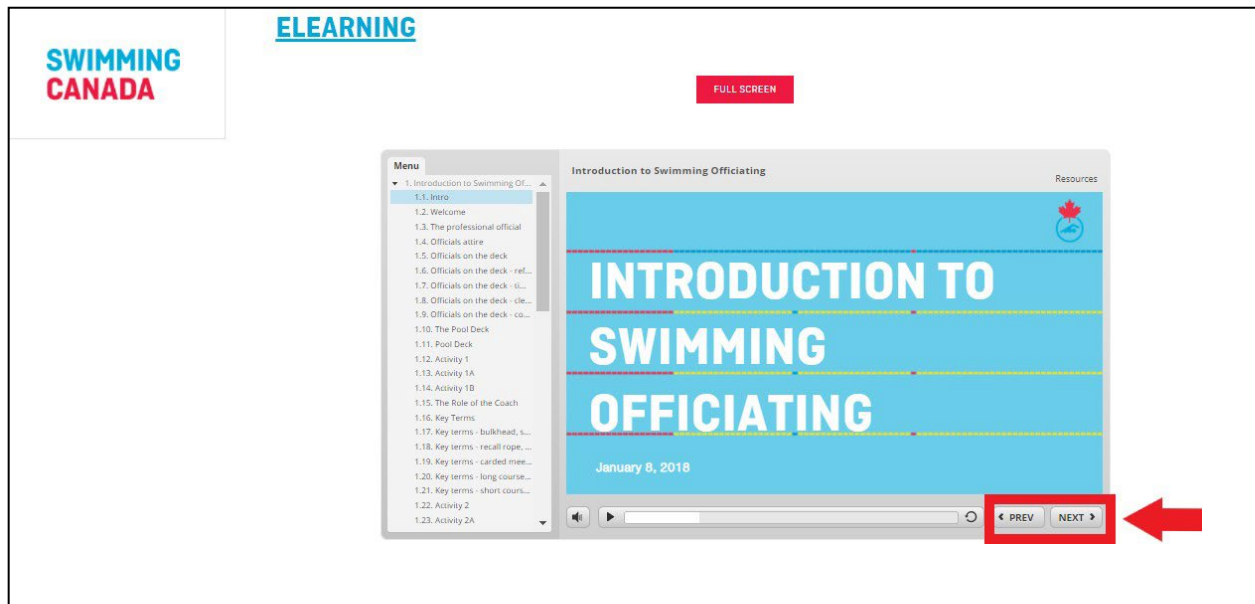
Clicking the **Logout** tab will sign you out of the LMS and return you to the main landing page for the LMS (<https://edu.swimming.ca/>)

Working through an eLearning module

In the LMS, the following eLearning modules are available to help with your certification.

- Intro to Officiating (Timekeeper)
- Intro to Officiating (Timekeeper) REFRESHER
- Safety Marshal eLearning module
- Chief Timekeeper eLearning module
- Clerk of Course eLearning module
- Canadian Para Swimming Online Deck Officials

Once you have enrolled in an eLearning module, the module will appear on your screen and will walk you through each slide. The eLearning module's are narrated and the instructions on how to complete the eLearning module is included in the introduction of each module. To move to the next or previous slide, you will use the arrows on the bottom right of the module.



Throughout the modules, there will be questions to test your knowledge of the content. You will not be able to continue through the module without correctly completing the questions in the modules.

Note: You can only resume a course on the same electronic device and in the selected language. If you are using a tablet, you may be required to download an app in order to play the eLearning module.







Enrolling in a Clinic

You can browse through the clinics available to you by clicking on the **Clinics** tab at the top of the page. Once in the **Clinics** tab, you can enroll in a clinic by clicking the red **Register** button found beside the clinic of choice. The registration deadline is included below the **Register** button for you to clearly know the deadline.

Before registering for a clinic, it is recommended to review the details provided. On the right side of the clinic there is a **Details** button. Some of the information that is included when selecting this tab is payment information, what you will need to bring, directions to the venue, parking information, etc.

The image below shows both where the **Register** and **Details** buttons can be found for a course.

Key Terms

List of acronyms and terms used throughout the user guide

Clinic

This term is used when referring to a course that is held in-person or online over a conferencing platform, such as Zoom. Official's clinics are available to active officials and provides the education material the official needs to progress through their certification.

eLearning module

Swimming Canada eLearning modules are available to all officials and provides the educational material the official needs to complete the module and progress through their certification.

Enroll

This term is used when someone registers to begin working on their eLearning module or clinic.

LMS

This acronym stands for **Learning Management System (LMS)**. Swimming Canada's LMS can be found at <https://edu.swimming.ca/>. The LMS has been specifically designed for Coaches and Officials education in Canada.

REMS

This acronym stands for **Registration and Events Management System**. Swimming Canada's REMS is Swimming Canada's national online database. The REMS can be found
