Update of Aquatic Infrastructure Push

Ontario municipalities need help to build 50-metre aquatic facilities

Ontario can help invest in more and larger recreational aquatic facilities to enhance health outcomes, stimulate the local economy, and provide complete communities.

Ontario is the only province where 50m pools developed by institutions and for major games outnumber those built by municipalities.

Ontario needs to take a proactive approach to pool construction, anticipating future needs rather than reacting to them.

Ontario should also support municipalities in building more sport friendly 25-metre pools

A 50-metre pool can bring three times the programming for twice the pool size.

These 50m pools allow municipalities to offer low-cost drop-in and recreational access, while enabling them to generate greater revenues for permitted and sport training uses.

A well-designed facility anchored by a 50m pool could attract large-scale competitions and events that smaller venues cannot accommodate.



The Ministry of Sport can partner with Ontario's aquatic leaders to develop a plan to build new regionally significant 50m aquatic centres in Ontario communities.

The province of Ontario needs to play a role in supporting studies to identify gaps in funding, developing, and investing in recreational aquatic facilities.

The Ministry of Sport can play a pivotal role in promoting and supporting amateur and professional sporting events through various funding programs.

By providing funding, the Ministry of Sport can support the development of recreational facilities and subsequently promote economic benefits to surrounding businesses through hotel and restaurant use.

Swimming Updates

2025 Canada Summer Games Project

Spring 2024

- Beginning in March 2024 following the Ontario Swimming Championships approximately 150 Olympic/Paralympic stream games eligible swimmers.
- Olympic stream swimmers were identified based on their percentage off of the World Class On-Track. These swimmers represented approximately 40 clubs.
- Paralympic stream swimmers were identified based on level of classification and IPC points total.

Fall 2024

- Identification transitioned to Olympic stream games eligible swimmers who were ranked within the Top 10 nationally in their events. This aligned with potential selection criteria.
- This dropped the number of swimmers to approximately 100 swimmers representing around 35 clubs
- Paralympic stream remained the same. Classification and performance levels continued to be monitored.

Pre-Selection Activities

- Planned preselection camps were organized in November 2024, January and April 2025.
- Camps were focused on providing core details around team selection, combined training opportunities for those eligible for potential selection.
- Para opportunities were a challenge from a swimmer/coach engagement standpoint as well as issues around classification that affected swimmer eligibility.

Team Selection

- Performance Window: February 26-June 15, 2025
 - Any LC performance at a multi-day heats/finals competition is considered.
 - Selection will take place the week of June 16, 2025
- Team Size: 32 Swimmers
 - 24 Olympic Stream
 - 4 Paralympic Stream
 - 4 Special Olympic Stream
 - We anticipate that these swimmers will represent approximately 20 clubs across the province.
- Final team selection will be announced early next week.

Age Group Coach Pathway Update

- New Swimming 201 Pre Course Module launching soon in LMS
 - If someone has taken the old pre course module, but not Swimming 201 yet, they will be required to do the new module prior to the Swimming 201
- Pilot for revamped Swimming 201 running in August
- Anyone that has taken Swimming 201/old Technical 2 and has not finished the pathway has until **NOVEMBER 30** to submit their portfolio
 - if they do not meet this deadline, they will have to retake Swimming 201 if they are wanting to continue in the pathway
- Anyone who has completed the Portfolio has until April 1, 2026 to do the in person evaluation step.

Officials Clinic Management on LMS: Upcoming Changes

- Beginning July 15, 2025 Club Official Administrators and Officials will no longer be able to add clinic credentials in REMS <u>from REMS</u> as we switch to full management of clinics to the LMS.
- All clinics need to be added to the LMS and once completed, information can then be sent directly to the REMS from the LMS to add credentials for officials.

Swimming Canada Warm-up Safety Procedures

A reminder that Swimmers must enter the pool FEET FIRST in a cautious manner,, from a standing or sitting position.

- Jumping feet first into a crowded lane is not a cautious manner.
- Swimmers witnessed by a Safety Marshal diving or entering the water in a
 dangerous fashion <u>may be removed</u>, <u>by the Referee</u>, <u>without warning from their</u>
 <u>first individual event</u> following the warm-up period in which the violation occurred
 and the alternates in that event notified should that event be a final.

Dive Starts

The Starter shall report a swimmer to the Referee for misconduct taking place at the start as a result of kicking the footrest/backplate of the starting blocks per Swimming Canada Section II C2.3.2. The Referee may disqualify a swimmer for such misconduct.

 Coaches must ensure swimmers are informed of this rule and its potential consequences.
